William H. Rew, a high es-  
teemed resident of Corning for  
over 50 years, dropped dead at 11  
o'clock this morning, May 11,  
1928, at his home, 248 Sly ave-  
nue. Mr. Rew had not been well  
for the past two months but had  
been able to be around the house  
and yesterday he seemed to be in  
his usual health.

When his daughter, Mrs. War-  
ren B. Pluff went to his room at  
10:30 o'clock this morning he  
said that he had slept well and  
would soon get up. When he start-  
ed to dress he fell over, dead.  
Death was due to heart trouble.

Born at Dundee, September 2,  
1851, Mr. Rew was the son of  
James and Adelaide Lawrence  
Rew. On June 29, 1873, he was  
married to Almiri Nash of Horse-  
heads, whose death occurred less  
than three months ago, February  
17, 1928. Grief over his wife's  
death is believed to have aggrava-  
ted the heart condition.
