

KEEGAN STORE SUSPECTS HELD IN BINGHAMTON

Sergeant Walter Helm of the Ithaca Police Department and L. Burr Keegan, local clothier, whose store was looted of clothes and money last Tuesday night, have returned from Binghamton, where yesterday they tried to identify the two robbers caught there. That the two men are not the two who robbed Ithaca's clothing store was found out in the examination in the Binghamton police depot. The Ithaca police will have to look other wheres for the guilty parties, the chief announced this morning.

Robert Moynihan of 164 Vain Street, Syracuse, and Maxwell S. French of 1603 South State Street, Syracuse, the two young men who, it was suspected, stole clothes and money from the store of L. Burr Keegan here last week, and later in Binghamton took \$64 from the safe of the American Cigar Company a few moments after rifling the cash drawer in the Binghamton Phonograph Company store of \$19, were charged with grand larceny in the second degree yesterday in Binghamton city court. Attorney J. F. Sullivan entered a plea of not guilty for the young men, and after examination had been waived they were held to await grand jury action.

Chief of Detectives Loren W. Rummer, Detective Jeremiah Donohue, Robert L. Hynes and John I. Crawford of Binghamton are continuing their investigation of the movements of the youths since they appeared in the city. Several proprietors of stores who have recently missed money from their cash receptacles will be asked to call at police headquarters and give the pair "the up and down."

It is said that the police have a well founded suspicion that the pilfering was not confined to the cigar company office and the phonograph store. They expect to have the several ends of the story weaved together soon.

Detective Sergeant Walter Helm and Mr. Keegan of this city were in Binghamton yesterday. It was thought that the two boys might be implicated in two robberies which took place Tuesday in the Ezra Cornell town.
