

YOUTH ARRESTED AGAIN AS COURT SETS HIM FREE

Robert Monihan, Indicted
With Maxwell French, Jailed
on Cortland Charge.

Robert Monihan, aged 18 years, of Syracuse, indicted with Maxwell French, who was sentenced to two years in Auburn prison by County Judge Benjamin Baker last week on a charge of grand larceny, second degree, pleaded guilty before Judge Baker in chambers this morning to a similar charge and was placed on probation to Samuel J. Koerbel, humane agent.

The two youths admitted taking \$62 from a drawer in the safe at the American Cigar Co. office on Wall street last September and with attempting to take money from the cash drawer in the office of the Binghamton Phonograph Co. on Washington street.

In asking for a suspended sentence for Monihan upon his arraignment today, Attorney Edward F. Ronan pointed out that the young man never before had been convicted of a crime and that he was ready to make good the sum of \$26.17, which added to the money taken from Monihan and French following their arrest, would make up the total of the money they admitted stealing.

After Judge Baker has suspended sentence, Under Sheriff John V. Bartley, who had accompanied Monihan from the jail, told the court that he had just received a warrant for Monihan's arrest on a similar charge in Cortland. The Under Sheriff was instructed to take Monihan back to jail. Humane Agent Koerbel said he would get in touch with the Cortland authorities and see what arrangements could be made in disposing of the second larceny charge.

In an affidavit accompanying the Cortland warrant, Monihan is charged with having entered a store conducted by Frank Corwin at 5 Court street, Cortland, and taking \$62 in cash and a check for \$30
